

Application Overview

This year the Department is using MAX.gov Survey to collect SRSA applications. The application process has been streamlined and we anticipate it will take approximately 30 minutes to submit an application.

All school districts that meet the SRSA eligibility requirements for FY 2020 will receive a **unique application invitation via email**, which will enable them to access the SRSA application in MAX Survey.

Your school district has been identified as eligible for funding under the **Rural Education Achievement Program (REAP)** for the 2020-2021 school year. REAP contains two programs: the Small, Rural School Achievement (SRSA) grant program and the Rural and Low-Income School (RLIS) grant program. The Department has implemented a new streamlined application process for the SRSA program beginning with school year 2020-2021. School districts are now able to access the application simply by clicking on the link provided at the end of this email, which is unique to ABC Example School District. General Education Provisions Act (GEPA) Statement

Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act requires that applicants for Small, Rural School Achievement (SRSA) funds include in their application a description of the steps the applicant proposes to take to ensure equitable access to, and participation in, the SRSA program for students, teachers, and other SRSA beneficiaries with special needs. This provision allows applicants discretion in developing the required description. The statute highlights six types of barriers that can impede equitable access or participation: gender, race, national origin, color, disability, or age. Based on local circumstances, you should determine whether these or other barriers may prevent your students, teachers, etc., from such access or participation in the SRSA-funded project or activity. The description of steps to be taken to overcome these barriers need not be lengthy; you may provide a clear and succinct description of how you plan to address those barriers that are applicable to your circumstances.

Section 427 is not intended to duplicate the requirements of civil rights statutes, but rather to ensure that, in designing their projects, applicants for Federal funds address equity concerns that may affect the ability of certain potential beneficiaries to fully participate in the project and to achieve to high standards. Consistent with program requirements and its approved application, an applicant may use the Federal funds awarded to it to eliminate barriers it identifies.

The General Education Provisions Act (GEPA) statement consists of:

1. A specific explanation of your school district's proposed use(s) of SRSA grant funds; and
2. A specific explanation of how your school district will use SRSA funds in a way that addresses barriers to access and does not discriminate on the basis of any federally-protected category.

Ensure Your DUNS Number Is Active and Registered in the SAM.gov

- Register your school district's nine-digit DUNS number with SAM at www.SAM.gov
- Your school district's DUNS must be **active and registered in SAM** in order to access the district's SRSA grant funds in G5. Grantee school districts without an active DUNS number in SAM will have a Route Payment flag attached to their accounts, prohibiting access to funds until the DUNS is active and registered in SAM.

- **February 3, 2020:** SRSA application invite sent to school district email
- **April 17, 2020:** SRSA application closes
- **July 2020:** SRSA grant funds awarded
- **September 30, 2022:** 2020 SRSA award obligation deadline
- **December 30, 2022:** 2020 SRSA award liquidation deadline

Note that the performance period has been extended by 12 months
