This letter addresses the removal of the condition that the U.S. Department of Education (the Department) placed on Colorado's fiscal year (FY) 2019 Title I, Part A grant award.

The condition related to the participation rate of students taking science assessments using alternate assessments of alternate academic achievement standards (AA-AAAS) administered in the State in the 2017-2018 school year (see

https://www2.ed.gov/policy/elsec/guid/stateletters/1percentconsequenceco.pdf). Colorado demonstrated that, for the 2018-2019 school year, it assessed fewer than 1.0 percent of all students in science with an AA-AAAS, in compliance with section 1111(b)(2)(D)(i)(I) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). This fulfills the terms of this condition on Colorado's FY 2019 Title I, Part A grant. As a result, the Department is removing this condition.
