# American Rescue Plan <br> Supporting the Specific Needs of Homeless Children and Youth: Reservation from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund 

Authorized by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Public Law 117-2
Methodology for Calculating Allocations
Section 2001(b) of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) requires the U.S. Department of Education (Department) to reserve $\$ 800,000,000$ from the $\$ 122,774,800,000$ provided for the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER) to support the specific needs of homeless children and youth (ARP homeless reservation).

As noted in the letter, the Department is reserving $\$ 1,000,000$ of the $\$ 800,000,000$ for national activities. Consistent with the manner in which the Department awards funds to State educational agencies under the McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children and Youth Act, the Department is allocating the remaining $\$ 799,000,000$ to States based on the proportion that each State received under Title I, Part A (Title I) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) in the most recent fiscal year.

Furthermore, as noted in the letter, the Department has decided to award 25 percent of each State's allocation immediately (ARP Homeless I) and will award the remaining 75 percent (ARP Homeless II) after promulgating regulations that will apply to ARP Homeless II. The following table lists each State's total allocation, ARP Homeless I allocation, and ARP Homeless II allocation.
