

## Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund

Authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Public Law 116-136

### Methodology for Calculating Allocations (Revised June 25, 2021)

Section 18001(b) of the CARES Act requires the Department of Education (Department), after reserving 2 percent of the \$30.75 billion appropriated for the Education Stabilization fund for the Outlying Areas (1/2 of 1 percent), the Bureau of Indian Education at the Department of the Interior (1/2 of 1 percent), and competitive awards to States with the highest coronavirus burden (1 percent), to reserve 9.8 percent of remaining funds, or \$2,953,230,000, for the Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (GEER Fund) authorized under section 18002 of the CARES Act. Section 18002(b) of the CARES Act requires the Department to allocate 60 percent of funds reserved for the GEER Fund based on each State's relative population of individuals aged 5 through 24 and 40 percent based on each State's relative number of children counted under section 1124(c) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (i.e., children counted for the purposes of making Title I, Part A formula grants to local educational agencies, or the Title I, Part A formula count). The Department used the most recent data available for both elements of this formula to determine GEER Fund allocations to States: (1) the 2018 State-level ages 5 to 24 resident population data that the U.S. Census Bureau released in June 2019, and (2) the Title I, Part A formula count from the fiscal year 2020 preliminary Title I, Part A allocations that the Department provided to Congress on January 22, 2020, and to States on January 23, 2020.

Due to a downward revision by a State to the Title I, Part A formula count data that the Department used to calculate the GEER Fund allocations made available under the CARES Act, the Department has revised the GEER Fund allocations. The Department will make supplemental GEER I awards to each State unless a State declines its supplemental award.
