Definition of high-need students: Students at-risk of dropping out, as defined by the Texas Education Agency, and economically disadvantaged students.

Brief project description including project activities: YLN positively impacts noncognitive, academic mindsets of middle school students by being placed as tutors of K-1 students and engaging families of YLN students in youth action research equity projects.

Summary of project objectives and expected outcomes: After a year of participation in YLN, students will show a 50% improvement in academic mindsets, a 40% decrease in absenteeism, and a 35% increase in middle school Texas exams for 8th grade math and English language arts.

Partnering organizations: Education Service Center – Region 19; Twelve school districts in West Texas that include Canutillo ISD, Dell City ISD, Fabens ISD, San Elizario ISD, and Sierra Blanca ISD. Hatch ISD in New Mexico is also a YLN partner.
