# SELECTION CRITERIA--OVERVIEW

<b>Quality of the Project Design</b>	35
<b>Significance</b>	25
<b>Quality of the Management Plan</b>	20
<b>Quality of the Project Evaluation</b>	20
<i>Total Selection Criteria Points:</i>	<b>100</b>
<b>CPP 1 – Increasing Educator Diversity</b>	5
<b>CPP 2 – Equity in Student Access...</b>	3
<b>CPP 3 --Meeting Student Social, Emotional, and Academic Needs</b>	2
<i>Maximum Total Application Points</i>	<b>110</b>

# SELECTION CRITERIA

## QUALITY OF THE PROJECT DESIGN (35 POINTS)

Training or professional development services

...are of sufficient quality, intensity, and duration to lead to improvements in practice among the recipients of those services.

Build capacity and yield results

...project is designed to build capacity and yield results that will extend beyond the period of Federal financial assistance

Conceptual framework

...conceptual framework underlying the proposed research or demonstration activities and the quality of that framework





# SELECTION CRITERIA

## PROJECT DESIGN CONT. (35 POINTS)

### Collaboration of Partners

“...the collaboration of appropriate partners for maximizing the effectiveness of project services.”

### Address Need

“The extent to which the design of the proposed project is appropriate to, and will successfully address, the needs of the target population or other identified needs.”

# SELECTION CRITERIA

## SIGNIFICANCE (25 POINTS)

### Significance of Outcomes

“...importance or magnitude of the results or outcomes likely to be attained by the proposed project, especially improvements in teaching and student achievement.”

### Reasonable Costs

“The extent to which the costs are reasonable in relation to the number of persons to be served and to the anticipated results and benefits.”



# SELECTION CRITERIA

## SIGNIFICANCE CONT. (25 POINTS)

### Benefits at End of Federal Funding

“The potential for the incorporation of project purposes, activities, or benefits into the ongoing program of the agency or organization at the end of Federal funding.”

### Dissemination

“...results of the proposed project are to be disseminated in ways that will enable others to use the information or strategies.”

# SELECTION CRITERIA

## QUALITY OF THE MANAGEMENT PLAN (20 POINTS)

Clear and  
Measurable  
Outcomes

“...goals, objectives, and outcomes to be achieved by the proposed project are clearly specified and measurable.”

Clear Plan  
to Keep  
Project on  
Track

“...plan to achieve the objectives of the proposed project on time and within budget, including clearly defined responsibilities, timelines, and milestones...”

# SELECTION CRITERIA

## QUALITY OF THE PROJECT EVALUATION (20 POINTS)

Produce  
Rigorous  
Evidence

“...produce evidence about the project's effectiveness that would meet WWC Standards with or without reservations...”

Feedback  
and Periodic  
Assessment

“The extent to which the methods of evaluation will provide performance feedback and permit periodic assessment of progress toward achieving intended outcomes.”

Quantitative  
and  
Qualitative  
Data

“...methods of evaluation include the use of objective performance measures that are clearly related to the intended outcomes of the project and will produce quantitative and qualitative data...”



# SELECTION CRITERIA

## QUALITY OF THE PROJECT EVALUATION- CONT. (20 POINTS)

### Relevant Outcomes

“The extent to which the methods of evaluation will provide valid and reliable performance data on Relevant Outcomes.”

### Project Replication

“...the design for implementing and evaluating the proposed project will result in information to guide possible replication of project activities or strategies, including information about the effectiveness of the approach or strategies employed by the project.”

# APPLICATION PROCESS

## SUBMITTING AN APPLICATION

- Submit applications via Grants.gov.
- Applicants must complete the Grants.gov registration process.
- Go to the Applicants tab, then the Get Registered section, then the Organization Applicant Registration section.
- You must obtain a DUNS number or Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and register with SAM (System for Award Management) as part of this process.
- An applicant that does not have an active SAM registration can still register with Grants.gov, but must contact the Grants.gov Support Desk

# APPLICATION PROCESS

## APPLYING FOR A SEED GRANT

- To apply for a SEED grant, enter keyword “SEED” in the search bar on the right side of the Grants.gov homepage.
- Select **ED-GRANTS-040422-001**, which is the Opportunity Number for this competition. Click on the link, then click on the Package tab. Under Actions, click Select Package and follow the instructions.
- Please review the Grants.gov Applicant FAQs as you prepare and submit your application.

- General Education Provisions Act (GEPA) Requirements - Section 427
- Grants.gov Certification Regarding Lobbying (formerly ED 80-0013)
- SF 424B Form - Assurances, Non-Construction Programs
