

Save the Children, (AR) in collaboration with Partners for Rural Impact, proposes to conduct the following activities—statewide asset mapping; establishing regional sites in urban and rural locales; statewide training of parents and educators to include: Mapp’s Dual-Capacity Framework convenings, National Network of Partnership Schools (NNPS)/Epstein’s types of family involvement convenings, training (differentiating at key cradle-to-career levels; face-to-face and online units developed); *Parent Nation* mobilization training, peer-to-peer leadership development, parents in service roles (VISTA, AmeriCorps); parent identification and amelioration of barriers for children; ongoing work with community-based organizations through events, collaboration; and an evaluation of development and implementation. The project proposes to serve roughly 700,000 children and students as well as their families. The Center proposes to serve 45 school districts in Arkansas.
