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




#### What is the MES?

The Master Eligibility Spreadsheet (MES) is REAP's online public spreadsheet posted in mid-January that shows:

- All LEAs in the nation
- REAP eligibility status—including dualeligibility
- Estimated award allocations for eligible REAP programs
- Title program allocations used in the SRSA formula
- General LEA contact information
- SRSA Application Submission Status

**Note**: All data on this spreadsheet should be reviewed for accuracy by each LEA



#### **MES Related Questions**

- 1. What are some of the common reasons why an LEA's eligibility or estimated award would change from year to year? (ex. Last year the LEA was dual-eligible, but this year only RLIS eligible).
- 2. One of our contacts is not correct, how can we change this?
- 3. How can an LEA challenge data that may have been reported incorrectly?





#### What is REAP?

- The Rural Education Achievement Program (REAP, or Title V, Part B) is a grant
  program designed to address the unique needs of rural school districts that may lack
  the personnel and resources to compete effectively for Federal competitive grants and
  that often receive grant allocations in amounts that are too small to be effective in
  meeting their intended purposes.
- REAP consists of two formula grant programs:
  - Small, Rural School Achievement (SRSA): Department makes grants directly to local educational agencies (LEAs).
  - Rural and Low-Income School (RLIS): Department makes grants to State educational agencies (SEAs); SEAs administer subgrants to LEAs.

# How are REAP funds distributed?



RLIS funds are granted to SEAs who in turn make subgrants to eligible LEAs



Dual-Eligible LEAs must select which grant program they wish to participate in!








SRSA funds are granted directly from the Department to eligible LEAs and are managed in G5

#### **REAP Program Funding Flexibilities**

- RLIS and SRSA funds can be used for activities that are allowable under multiple Title programs: Title I, Part A; Title II, Part A; Title III; Title IV, Part A; parental involvement activities (RLIS only); and Title IV, Part B (SRSA only).
- AFUA is an available flexibility for all SRSA-eligible LEAs
- SRSA fund use can be changed any time during the performance period, as long as the activity is allowable under SRSA

#### **REAP Program Questions**

- 1. For Dual-Eligible LEAs are there any benefits to choose RLIS or SRSA over the others?
- 2. I'm a dual-eligible LEA and last year I was estimated to receive more under SRSA so I applied. For FY23, I am estimated to receive more under RLIS. Can I switch back and forth between these two grant programs or will that impact my access to each year's award?

- The email contains identifying information about the LEA, helpful resources, and a unique application link.




#### **Verifying your UEI**

- In order to access SRSA grant funds an LEA must have an active UEI in SAM.gov
- If your LEA already has a UEI on file with REAP, it will auto-populate into your SRSA
  application, please review the UEI and edit if needed.
- If the field is blank, this means that your LEA has not provided their UEI to REAP or has not yet obtained and registered a UEI on SAM.gov.





#### **GEPA Statements**



- Take time to read all instructions and consider your LEA's unique circumstances!
- The LEA's GEPA statement from FY 2022 will populate in the text box if available.
- If no GEPA statement was submitted in FY 2022, or if the LEA did not submit an FY 2022 SRSA application, the box will be blank.



#### **GEPA Statement Requirement**

- Section 427 of the GEPA requires U.S. Department of Education grantees to describe the steps they will take to **ensure equitable access to, and participation in** the Federally assisted program (in this case, SRSA) by addressing the special needs of students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries.
- Consider the **six types of barriers** that can impede equitable access of participation: gender, race, national origin, color, disability, or age.
- Determine, **based on local circumstances**, whether these or other barriers may prevent students, teacher, or other beneficiaries from such access or participation in an SRSA-funded project or activity.

#### **Next Steps:**

- Unique Entity Identifier (UEI): An LEA <u>must</u> have a UEI that is <u>registered and active</u> in the System for Award Management (SAM) to receive SRSA grant funds. You may check your UEI registration status by logging into your <u>SAM.gov account</u> and clicking "Check Entity Status." If you do not have a SAM.gov account or need assistance with the UEI reactivation process, contact the SAM Federal Service Desk by phone (1-866-606-8220) or the <u>FSD Live Chat</u>. If your LEA does not have a UEI with an active registration, you will be unable to receive SRSA funds.
- G5 Account and Payee Access: An LEA must also ensure the correct personnel have a G5.gov account as well as Payee Access in order to manage any awarded SRSA grant funds in G5. To begin the account creation and Payee Access process, follow the steps in REAP's Guide for Accessing SRSA Funds. - Grant Award Notification (GAN): Once the U.S. Department of Education (Department) issues the FY 2023 SRSA awards, each grantee LEA will receive a GAN generated through G5. The Authorized Representative and secondary contact of each LEA will be sent an






#### Relationship Between SAM and G5




The UEI needs to be active to withdraw funds from G5


