Data Exchange Process

Indiana's data-sharing agreement is between the Indiana Department of Education, the State educational agency (SEA), and the Indiana Department of Child Services, the child welfare agency (CWA). The original purpose of the data-sharing agreement was to document eligibility for free and reduced-price lunch from the National School Lunch Program. More recently, Indiana's agreement has been supported by State legislation championed by a foster care advocacy group, Foster Success.

The Indiana data exchange process occurs once a month and takes less than 0.01 FTE to implement during the academic year. The current exchange process, which will be replaced with a new system in 2023, occurs as follows:



The CWA prepares the data. The CWA Division Director of Education Services generates a dataset of children in foster care. The dataset is combined with a food and nutrition database using Biztalk, a Microsoft data integration product.



The CWA shares data with the SEA. The SEA then merges the combined CWA/Food and Nutrition Service dataset with SEA enrollment data using Biztalk. The match is based primarily on the child's name and date of birth, but in some instances, it is also based on the school attended, according to the CWA.



The SEA shares data with local educational agencies (LEAs). After the data are matched, users can log into a portal to obtain their data.



Some key facilitators that support the implementation of Indiana's data-sharing agreement include:

- 1. The data-sharing agreement is governed by a strong MOU and is executed by the Indiana Management Performance Hub. This State agency is responsible for implementing all interagency data-sharing agreements.
- 2. The use of an automated data exchange minimizes required resources. Indiana also uses practices to ensure high-quality data, such as a tracking system for child name changes, which can occur due to changes in child custody arrangements.
- 3. The data-sharing agreement is facilitated by a strong partnership between the SEA and the CWA. The CWA has solicited input from the SEA and LEAs on how to structure the CWA forms (e.g., best interest determination) to ensure data fields can be shared with educators in an accessible way.



Future Opportunities

Several opportunities related to the implementation of the data-sharing agreement include:

- 1. Working with staff responsible for ensuring legal compliance to overcome legal barriers that arise in the data agreement development process.
- 2. Including current education data, beyond outcomes, in the data exchange, which Indiana's new data exchange, set to be released in 2023, intends to do.
