Competitive Preference Priorities: This project addresses Absolute Priority 1: Professional Development in American History, Civics and Government alongside Competitive Preference Priorities 1: Innovative Activities for Civic Engagement and 2: Promoting Student Equity.

Project Partners: CFA is the lead applicant on this project and is an eligible 501c3 organization. CFA works in collaboration with the Arizona State University Participatory Governance Initiative on program implementation and research and evaluation. CFA partners with statewide and national organizations on civic education and participatory democracy.
