Mission


The School Ambassador Fellowship is a United States Department of Education competition-based program designed to improve **educational outcomes** for students by leveraging the **expertise of school-based practitioners** in the creation, dissemination, and evaluation of national education policy.

Vision

The Fellowship seeks to:

- create a community of teachers, principals, counselors, psychologists, social workers and other school staff members who share expertise and collaborate with leaders in the federal government on national education issues;
- involve educators who work daily with students and teachers in developing policies that holistically affect learning environments;
- highlight practitioners' voices and expand educators' critical leadership at the national, state and local levels.



Eligibility

Eligibile candidates <u>must</u>:

- Be a **US Citizen** or Permanent Resident
- Have at least five (5) years of experience as an educator in a preK-12 school setting (up to and including the current school year).
- Have daily meaningful interactions with students and educators in a school setting in their role
- **Employed** by a traditional accredited public, charter, private, virtual, military (DoDEA), or tribal (BIE) **school/district**.
- Currently be a teacher, administrator, student support provider, or other school staff member (and anticipate being employed in this role during the next school year).

Personal Statement Video

In a video of no more than **3 minutes in length**, provide a personal statement that describes how your **personal and professional experiences would benefit the School Ambassador Fellowship**, the Department of Education, and education communities in general.

Your personal statement abstract should address:

- Your **personal and professional experiences** have defined you as an educator;
- The extent to which you have used your career to be an agent of change within your local school district, state, or at the national level; and
- The extent to which you will leverage your professional networks, resources, and abilities to promote the Secretary of Education's priorities and the Department's strategic goals and initiatives.

Project Abstract

Each School Ambassador Fellow will identify a challenge facing students and/or educators within their school, district, state, or nationwide that they will work towards addressing through completion of a yearlong action research project.

Your project abstract should address:

- A challenge that your school community is facing;
- Resources and networks you will leverage for sustainability;
- The benchmarks you'll use to measure short, mid, and long-term success;
- How your project outcome aligns with the **Secretary of Education's priorities**.
