## **Deadlines and Announcements**

GEER Year 4 (FY23) Data Collection: The updated GEER Year (FY23) data collection form, along with the Summary of Key Differences, which outlines the changes from GEER Year 3 (FY22) to GEER Year 4 (FY23) have been posted to the GEER Grantee Help page under the Fiscal Year 2023 (Year 4) Annual Performance Reporting Resources accordion. Grantees will be notified when the schedule for the GEER collection period has been announced, along with information regarding upcoming webinars. **ESSER Year 4 (FY23) Data Collection**: The updated <u>ESSER Year 4 (FY23) data collection form</u>, along with the <u>Summary of Key Differences</u>, which outlines the changes from ESSER Year 3 (FY22) to ESSER Year 4 (FY23) have been posted to the <u>ESSER Grantee Help</u> page under the *Fiscal Year 2023 (Year 4) Annual Performance*Reporting Resources accordion. Optional Template for LEA-Level MOEquity Data, Due 12/31/23: The Notice of Final Requirement establishes requirements for publishing LEA-level maintenance of equity data to demonstrate that LEAs are maintaining both fiscal and staffing equity in fiscal years 2022 and 2023. The deadline for SEAs to publish this applicable LEA high-poverty school data for FY 2023 is 12/31/23. FY 2023 data includes a comparison of school year 2021-2022 data with school year 2022-2023 data to determine whether high-poverty schools within applicable LEAs received disproportionate per-pupil funding and/or full time equivalent (FTE) staff. The Department is providing this optional template for SEAs to collect and submit data from LEAs. LEAs that are excepted from the LEA-level MOEquity requirement in FY 2023 are not subject to this reporting requirement. SEAs that are unable to provide the data by this deadline should send an extension request to their State mailbox with a specific extension date and reason for the request. If an extension is not required, please send a copy of the data and the link to where it is posted on the SEA's website to your State mailbox by 12/31/23.

**Davis-Bacon Regulatory Update**: The Office of State and Grantee Relations, in partnership with the U.S. Department of Labor, held an Office Hours session on 12/6/23 to discuss the October 2023 Davis-Bacon regulatory update. This session provided an overview of the key changes in the regulations that impact construction, renovation, and repair projects supported with Federal education funds. The presentation and responses to follow-up questions will be posted soon.

**ARP Liquidation Extension Request Information**: The Department has communicated that the general liquidation extension that has been available under the CARES and CRRSA Acts will be available for ARP Act programs. Additional information, including a request template and updated frequently asked questions document will be available soon. See the Department's 9/18/23 <u>communication</u> for additional information.

Beware of emails soliciting payment for SAM.gov registration or renewal: Grantees and other entities are reporting they have received sophisticated emails that appear to be from SAM.gov. These emails include a phone number that is not the GSA Help Desk, but rather will solicit payment to renew registration. SAM.gov is free and will never ask for payment.
